Job Title: Educational Facilitator

Professional skills and experience -

- An educational background is desirable but not essential from Early Years to Key Stage 4, we work with a wide range of age ranges and abilities, experience working with children on some level is an essential requirement of the role.
- A love of children's literature including new diverse stories, poetry, non-fiction and YA book knowledge is our superpower, having a good range of knowledge and the want to continue to explore new titles is paramount to this role.
- Experience of creative writing is desirable but not essential reading sits at the heart of learning, supporting students, and teachers to be creative in their approach to learning on every level is of the utmost importance including creative writing.

• A passion for performance - performance within storytelling is key to breaking down the barriers that reading can sometimes pose to children and it is an integral part of how Seven Stories approaches storytelling within our educational programme.

Key personal attributes:

- Assertiveness and confidence to keep the group focused, to keep any tasks on topic and the activities within the timeframe.
- Empathy and understanding the ability to listen to different perspectives and allow all voices to be heard.
- Authenticity- to build trust with the group, creating a motivational, inspiring learning experience.
- Conversational skills keep motivation up, ask the right questions, enable everyone to understand the trickier aspects of the workshop.
- Willingness to adapt be flexible and improvise as the situation requires it.
- Excellent organisational skills mapping out and preparing workshop activities, providing post-workshop follow-up reports, communicating clearly and regularly with Education Lead and the wider education team.
